Different Kinds of Love

In the Greek text there are two different words for "love" being used in this passage: "agapao" and "phileo". Agapao (or "agape") is the type of love mentioned in John 15:13: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." Phileo (as in "Philadelphia - city of brotherly love") is a sort of familial love of acquaintance.

John 21:15 ... Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love [agapao] me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love [phileo] you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love [agapao] me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love [phileo] you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." 17 He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love [phileo] me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love [phileo] me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love [phileo] you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."
